

Corporate Design

Objective: To propose a solution that solves an engineering related problem as posed by

a company.

Criteria: Originality, ingenuity, creativity, economic feasibility, and technical design.



Entrepreneurial Design

Objective: To develop a business plan for an innovative product, service or process. **Criteria:** Originality, market analysis, economic and technical feasibility, profitability and presentation.



First Year Team Design

Objective: To complete a design challenge that is divulged on the day of the event. The

solution must be implemented with limited time and materials. Students will

work in groups of four.

Criteria: Originality of design, functionality of prototype, team spirit and presentation.



Senior Team Design

Objective: To complete a design challenge that is divulged on the day of the event. The

solution must be implemented with limited time and materials. Students who

are in their third year and higher work in groups of four.

Criteria: Originality of design, functionality of prototype, team spirit and presentation.





Competition Categories



Editorial Communications

Objective: To present and defend an opinion on the sociological impact of a current

technological issue.

Criteria: Quality of research, ability to express opinions, and keeping audience

interest.



Explanatory Communications

Objective: To convey a technical subject or process such that it can be understood by

the general public.

Criteria: Quality of research, clarity, conciseness, presentation, public interest, and

the use of audiovisual aids.



Parliamentary Debate

Objective: To present a well-reasoned viewpoint with a minimum of presentation time in

teams of two.

Criteria: Ability to defend or refute a previously undisclosed resolution using the format

of parliamentary style debate.





Judging



The OEC welcomes your expertise to our judging committee. Judges typically have an engineering background, but anyone is welcome to join. You may volunteer to judge in any of the seven events.

There are many benefits to attending the OEC as a judge:
